Later, in **Luke 10:25-37,** an expert in the law asks Jesus, *"Who is my neighbor?"* Jesus responds with the Parable of the Good Samaritan and shows us that we can be a neighbor to anyone who crosses our path. Go on a journey with us and learn how your church can continue to grow in practicing these two great commandments.

This Leader's Guide will offer a breakdown of everything in this kit. It also shares the vision of the process of being a witness of Jesus. Study Guide

The Study Guide consists of **twelve sessions** that help your church members grow in their relationship with Jesus and will encourage them to share his love with others. The challenge to *fear, obey, love,* and *serve* God found in **Deuteronomy 10:12** seeks to motivate believers to share Christ as a genuine response to a personal relationship with him.

Prayer Map

The Prayer Map is a tool that will help you pray daily for your nation, your neighbors and your own needs. This resource is an excellent tool to teach and inspire your congregation to pray. We believe that the degree to which you adopt this tool yourself will be the degree to which you will see it impact your church.

Commitment Bookmark

The commitment bookmark is located on the first page of the study guide and is for everyone to keep as a reminder of their dedication to living out the two great commandments. The back of the bookmark can be used to write the names of the people for whom you commit to pray.

Engagers

Every week, as your church members pray for the opportunity to share the love of Jesus with their neighbors, they can utilize these Engagers. An Engager is a printed resource that leads to a follow-up website where neighbors can learn more about Jesus. The purpose of an Engager is not to avoid having a personal conversation with someone. Instead, it is a tool to provide your neighbor with the next step they can take in their faith journey. The Believer Pack has two Engager themes.



Bulk Quantities of Engagers

At the bottom of the Love Your Neighbor kit, you'll find four bundles of different Engagers. The large quantities (100 of each) of these materials will allow you to plan outreach events in your community. You can invite your entire congregation to participate or partner with other churches and organizations.

There are four different titles.

The first bulk pack is an Engager created specifically for children called **God's Wonderful Creation**. This Engager invites children to discover God's Creation and how the Lord Jesus wants to be their friend and give them salvation. It could be used during a



special event (such as a summer Bible school or church camp) to invite the children of your neighbors to your congregation.

You'll also find an Engager, *The Gift that Changed the World Forever*, created uniquely for the Christmas season. Christmas is one of the most active times in the local church and a season when so many are open to hearing about Jesus. You can plan a unique Christmas outreach and invite people to a church service using the Engager.

The third bulk Engager is an Easter theme titled **The Hope** of **Resurrection**. This is another excellent time to use the momentum of the holiday to share the gospel and reach out to the community around you. You could mobilize your congregation for a special outreach that invites people to church or an Easter event.



The final bulk Engager is designed for Global Outreach (GO) Month, which takes place in May every year. During the entire month, millions of Christians worldwide participate in praying for the harvest, caring for people, and sharing the gospel. *The End of Times* is a message of hope and preparation and is designed so you can participate in the GO Movement in your nation. 

WITNESS

Our lives are changed when we walk with Jesus. The early disciples knew this very well. Day after day, their lives were transformed as they saw the sick healed and the dead raised. After all they'd seen, nobody had to coerce them into telling others about it. Evangelism for them wasn't forced; it was natural. It started with seeing Jesus and telling others about what they had seen. They were witnesses. Being a witness is a process that begins with seeing Jesus and the work he has done in our lives. Then we get the opportunity to see our neighbors. This process then turns into us talking to Jesus and telling him about our neighbors in the place of prayer. Over time, there comes a moment when we are given the opportunity to tell our neighbors about Jesus and who he is in our lives. This isn't just one conversation but numerous interactions over time. We call this process See and Tell.



There are enough believers in the world that we would reach the entire world if every Christian shared Jesus with three people. Of course, it's not that simple. But it does mean it's not out of reach. Sharing the love of Jesus with our neighbors begins with knowing their name, understanding their circumstances, praying for them, meeting their needs, and offering hope. This is our calling as followers of Jesus — sharing a message of love that meets our neighbors right where they are. It starts with us. Let's be a witness to our world.

See Jesus

Being a witness begins with our encounters with Jesus. Before we can see ourselves, those around us, or our world, we must have our eyes opened by the love of Jesus. We cannot carry a love we are not deeply, consistently, and intentionally experiencing for ourselves. Seeing Christ's love draws us into wholeness, fills us with hope, and opens our eyes to the people around us.

See Your Neighbors


Loving our neighbors starts with seeing our neighbors. We can't love someone without first having a genuine interest and care for their life. We should enter every conversation knowing that everyone has broken and hurting parts of their lives. Loving our neighbors is about seeing how they may experience pain and how we can be a comfort to them.

Tell Jesus about Your Neighbors

Tell Jesus that you want to see your neighbors through his eyes. Pray for them and the things they are going through. Tell Jesus that you want to carry his heart for your neighbors.

Tell Your Neighbors About Jesus

When the time is right, tell your neighbors about Jesus in a personal way. It should not be confrontational, nor should it lead to conflict. Our role is to bring peace into people's lives and situations. We are not sharing Jesus with our neighbors to win an argument or to have them say a prayer of salvation. Our primary task is to help people see Jesus. A simple glimpse will often leave people wanting to pursue him more. Only God can move the heart of people. Our role is to sow the seed. God's role is to bring the harvest.





INTRODUCTION

In the book of Deuteronomy we find a profound call to **fear** God, walk in **obedience**, **love** him wholeheartedly, and **serve** him faithfully. These principles form the basis of our Christian walk and invite us to share our faith with those around us. Through these sessions, we embark on an inspiring and transformative journey, rooted in **Deuteronomy 10:12.** Let us heed God's invitation to share our faith with our neighbors, classmates, co-workers, and family members, reflecting God's love in our words and actions.

Deuteronomy 10:12 sums up the core of our call: "And now, Israel, what does the Lord your God ask of you but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in obedience to him, to love him, to serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul."

Let's see the requirements that the Lord asked of the people of Israel and that he now demands of us: **fear, obedience, love** and **service**. Let's try to see them as a stairway, which, when you climb them, you can't go to the next stair without stepping on the previous one.

Fearing God is not about trembling with terror, but about acknowledging his awesome majesty and holiness, which shapes our reverence and obedience.

Walking in **obedience** to God's commandments is an outpouring of our fear of God. As we submit to his will and align our lives with his Word, we demonstrate our reverence and trust in his wisdom and guidance. Obedience becomes the natural response of a heart captivated by God's love and transformed by his grace.

Love is at the center of our Christian faith. God's love for us is limitless, and as we grow in our love for him, we are compelled to love others. Sharing our faith is an expression of this love, as we want others to experience the transforming power of God's grace and salvation. Love motivates us to bridge gaps, extend compassion, and meet the needs of those around us.

Service is an integral component of our Christian walk. By serving others, we reflect the selfless love of Christ. Our acts of service become tangible expressions of our faith, offering glimpses of God's character and drawing others closer to him. 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Each session has been designed to support you while you share, we encourage you to enrich each session with your own input. It is good that the leader can motivate the members of the group at each meeting to distribute the Engager Cards (at least 1 each week). You can also start each meeting by checking if every group members made the **"Live It"** challenge from the previous week. **Thank you for taking this challenge, we pray that the Lord uses you greatly!**

SESSION 1

WHAT DOES THE FEAR OF THE LORD MEAN?

Introduction

In the fallen world in which we live, human beings are filled with fear. We live worried about the situation of insecurity in our country. We are affected by the economic situation and different circumstances that cause anguish and concern. However, the fear of God that the Bible speaks of is a fear that leads us to trust his nature and character, motivating us to live in a state of total awe.

I. Reverence and Awe of God's Majesty

<u>Psalm 111:10</u> states, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow his precepts have good understanding." Fearing the Lord implies acknowledging his supreme **authority**, **majesty**, and **holiness**. It is a posture of reverence and wonder, realizing our **littleness** in comparison to his **greatness**. This fear leads us to approach God with **humility** and **respect**.

II. Turn Away from Sin and Evil

<u>Proverbs 8:13</u> says, "To fear the Lord is to hate evil;" Fearing the Lord forces us to turn away from **sin** and **evil**, knowing that they oppose the character and **will** of God. This fear motivates us to seek justice and **holiness**, wanting to honor and please God in all areas of our *lives*. It is a transforming fear that leads to **repentance** and a renewed **commitment** to live according to God's Word.

III. Trusting in God's Sovereignty and Provision

<u>Psalm 34:9</u> assures: "Fear the Lord, you his holy people, for those who fear him lack nothing." Fearing the Lord involves placing our trust in his **sovereignty** and **provision**. We acknowledge that he is the source of all blessings, wisdom, and guidance. This **fear** instills in us the confidence that God will provide for our **needs** and guide us faithfully through all **circumstances**, leading us to surrender and depend on him completely.

IV. Seek and Obey God's Instructions

<u>Psalm 25:14</u> reveals: "*The Lord confides in those who fear him; he makes his covenant known to them.*" Fearing the Lord implies a deep **desire** to seek and obey his **instructions**. It is an invitation to know God **intimately**, to walk in his ways and to align our lives with his **truth**. This fear cultivates a close relationship with God, where he reveals himself and his **purposes**.

V. Receive God's Discipline and Guidance

<u>Proverbs 3:7-8</u> advises: "Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil. This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones." Fearing the Lord allows us to receive his **discipline** and **guidance**. It keeps us humble and open to correction, knowing that God's **correction** is for our ultimate good. This fear leads to **restoration**, growth, and a life aligned with God's will.

Conclusion

The fear of the Lord encompasses reverence, turning away from evil, trusting in God's sovereignty, seeking and obeying his instructions, and receiving his discipline and guidance. Ponder how you can increase your reverent fear of God. Discuss where in your life God's character regarding his holiness has gone unnoticed and how he expects obedience from us out of genuine fear and awe.

Live It

This week share with another brother or sister in the faith (outside of your small group) what caught your attention the most about what the fear of the Lord means.

SESSION 2

WHY SHOULD WE FEAR THE LORD?

Introduction

The concept of fearing the Lord can be difficult to grasp, as fear is often associated with negative emotions. However, in the context of our relationship with God, fearing the Lord has a profound meaning. In this Bible study, we will study why we should fear the Lord. Through this session, we will discover the transformative power of the fear of the Lord, its impact on our lives, and the blessings that come from embracing this awe.

IV. Develope a Proper Perspective of the Greatness of God

<u>Psalm 95:3</u> urges: "For the Lord is the great God, the great King above all gods." Fearing the Lord helps us grasp the **magnitude** of his greatness. It allows us to see him as the Creator of the **universe**, the One who has all power and **authority**. This fear puts into perspective our finite **existence** and our utter **dependence** on his infinite wisdom and strength.

V. Cultivate a Heart of Wisdom and Humility

<u>Proverbs 15:33</u> teaches: "Wisdom's instruction is to fear the Lord, and humility comes before honor." Fearing the Lord leads to a heart of **wisdom** and **humility**. It gives us insight and understanding of God's **ways**, guiding our **choices** and **decisions**. This fear keeps us **humble**, recognizing that we are his creation and that true honor comes from aligning our lives with his will.

Conclusion

The fear of the Lord encompasses the recognition of God's supreme authority, the realization of his holiness, the recognition of his justice and righteousness, the development of a proper perspective of his greatness, and the cultivation of wisdom and humility. By embracing the fear of the Lord, we position ourselves to experience his transforming power in our lives. May the fear of the Lord shape our outlook, guide our actions, and draw us closer to the One who is worthy of all awe.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE OBEDIENT?

Introduction

Obedience is a fundamental aspect of our relationship with God. It involves willingly submitting to his will and aligning our actions with his commandments. In this Bible study, we will look at the meaning of obedience. Through this session, we will discover the meaning, benefits, and challenges of living a life characterized by obedience. Let's delve into God's Word to understand what it really means to be obedient and how it shapes our walk with him.

I. Surrender to God's Authority

<u>Romans 12:1</u> says, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." CHARACTERISTICS OF OBEDIENCE

Introduction

Obedience is a vital aspect of our relationship with God. It involves willingly submitting to his will and aligning our lives with his commandments. In this study session, we will study the characteristics of obedience exemplified by various individuals in the Scriptures. Through Biblical references, we will discover the key attributes that mark a life of obedience, allowing us to grow in our walk with God and experience the blessings that come from living in obedience to him.

I. Willingness to Listen and Follow

A key characteristic of obedience is the willingness to **listen** to God's voice and follow his instructions. In the story of Noah, God **commanded** him to build an ark (<u>Genesis 6:13-22</u>). Despite the **enormity** and unusual nature of the task, Noah faithfully obeyed God. Obedience requires being attentive to God's **leading** and being willing to act on his commands.

II. Fast Answer

Readiness to obey God's **directives** is another characteristic of obedience. At the call of the disciples, Jesus simply said, *"follow me"* (<u>Matthew 4:19</u>), and immediately they left everything to follow him. The disciples' obedience demonstrates their **readiness** to respond immediately to Jesus' call.

III. Unconditional Devotion

Obedience implies unconditional **devotion** to the will of God. When Abraham was called to sacrifice his son Isaac, he displayed **unwavering** faith and obedience (Genesis 22:1-18). His willingness to give up his most precious possession revealed his complete **trust** in God. True obedience requires undivided loyalty to God's purposes.

IV. Trusting in God's Sovereignty

One characteristic of obedience is trusting in God's **sovereignty** and wisdom. When Joseph was sold into slavery and later faced adversity in Egypt, he remained **obedient** and faithful, trusting that God had a greater plan (Genesis 39:2-6). Obedience involves **trusting** that God's ways are higher than ours.

V. Perseverance in Trials
